Types of Nouns!

Nouns come in three different types: **COMMON** nouns, **PROPER** nouns and **ABSTRACT** nouns

Can you match up the definitions of each to the correct type of noun?

Common Noun

A noun that cannot be seen, heard, smelt, felt or tasted

Proper Noun

The general, everyday term for an object

Abstract Noun


The formal name of a specific object, such as a company or country
